Description

The preceptorship will provide applicants with the fundamental tools for a correct diagnostic and treatment approach to marrow failures, including AA and PNH, in paediatric and adult patients. The spectrum of marrow failure syndromes in paediatric ages has a different composition compared to adults because of a larger proportion of inherited forms sometimes with masked or misleading phenotype. Also, AA and PNH show some difference as for approach and outcome respect to adult forms. One-day training on the management of a reference center is also foreseen in the program.

Objectives

- To learn differential diagnosis algorithm of marrow failure syndromes in adult and paediatric patients with a special focus on atypical/ attenuated forms and on PNH.
- To learn adult treatment algorithm for AA, PNH and for the most frequent inherited bone marrow failure syndromes.
- To learn pre/post treatment monitoring schedules of patients with marrow failure including AA and PNH
